Dear Year 13 student

I am writing to explain the arrangements for the rest of this academic year.

As you will know, the 7th May 2020 marks the last day for submission of A level work to your teachers. This work will support teachers in the process of allocating their 'best estimate' grades for each subject for which you are entered. Once this information has been collated it will be sent to the exam boards who will then apply their own calculations before determining a final grade.

I would like to take this opportunity, on behalf of your teachers, to thank you for all of your hard work. Of course, this hard work has not only been during the last few weeks — this is the culmination of 7 years of study in secondary school. You have been a delightful and committed year group, and your teachers will ensure that grades are allocated fairly to recognise your talents and the level of effort you have shown.

Of course, it will be the exam boards who will calculate the final grades, but we are confident that this also will be a fair process. The Government has stated repeatedly that students will not be disadvantaged by the situation caused by the pandemic, and that candidates will get the grades they deserve to allow them to progress to university, apprenticeships or the world of work.

Hanley Castle will always be your school, and we will always be there for you to turn to should you need help, support or advice.

I will, of course, be in touch again before 14th July. I would like to wish you and all your families the very best. I know that these have been tough and, in many cases, very sad times. I hope that we are now beginning to see a little light at the end of what has been a long tunnel.

In the meantime, stay at home, protect the NHS, save lives and be proud of everything you have achieved.
