Making the most of your revision time

Step 1 – Prepare. Make it easy.

• Select a past paper question/set of questions.

TIP... spend some time gathering, printing a whole stack and file them for future use.

Make sure you also have the answers ready.

Pick a question from an area you find challenging.







Step 2 – Revise. Choose your method.

- 20min

- Set a timer for 20 minutes.
- Revise what you need to know to answer the question you've chosen.

You could:

- Make a mind map
- Make flashcards and test yourself
- Explain to someone else
- Draw a diagram to show connections between themes
- Brain dump write down everything you can remember about a topic
- Use an online test for facts, vocabulary (e.g. Quizlet)





Step 3 - Do the question/s.

- Now answer the question in exam conditions.
- Don't use resources.
- Work in silence to ensure that you focus.
- TIP: If this is hard at home, go to revision club after school.




Step 4 – Mark your answer.

 As you see yourself improving, it can also help to motivate you.









Step 5 – Show your teacher
